Title: I See in You

1. CONNECT *Question of the Day. Highs and Lows. Share how last week's message influenced your week.*

What was one way you viewed those around you with an eternal lens this past week? *What did you notice about God and yourself?*

2. ENGAGE: SERMON REVIEW + DISCUSSION

Read the Scripture Passage . Recap of the Message.

- Re-read Matthew 9:9-13 as a LifeGroup. Pastor Albert discussed three realities Jesus conveys into this passage:
 - To Matthew, he says, "I see in you something greater";
 - To the Pharisees, he says, "I see in you self-righteousness";
 - To the Tax Collectors, he says, "I see in you sickness."
- Jesus calls each of us to "Follow [him]" in whichever three categories we find ourselves in today.

Discussion Questions

1. Jesus speaks into Matthew's experience and calls him to more: More than where he currently is, and more than what he's currently done. He calls Matthew to purpose and destiny. In what ways do you believe Jesus is calling you to purpose and identity in this season?
2. In this passage, we see the Pharisees only interested in finding out the diagnosis of the disease rather than the healing of the disease. Where are areas of your own life you're only willing to diagnose your "disease" rather than receive actual healing?
3. As you reflect, do you have self-righteousness or self-sustaining tendencies that keep Jesus from having the opportunity to heal you? How can you surrender these to the feet of Jesus this week?

3. APPLY: NEXT FAITHFUL STEP

1. As Jesus called Matthew to "follow" him, how can you pursue Jesus more fully this week?
2. Who are people in your life that you can say, "I see in you something greater" this week?
3. Pastor Albert stated that "sin" is equated/paralleled to "sickness" in this passage. What are ways and areas Jesus can bring healing to you?

4. PRAYER

Take some time to hear prayer requests from each member of your LifeGroup. Pray together for the MOVED series, for your upcoming weeks together as a LifeGroup, and for God's ongoing work in and through you.
