

1. Connect

Question of the Day. Highs and Lows. Share how last week's message influenced your week.

How did you respond to that call?

2. Engage: Sermon Review + Discussion

Read 1 Corinthians 12:12-26 together as a LifeGroup.

As you read this passage of Scripture, what stands out to you? Spend a couple of minutes making your own observations about the Scripture and share them together as a group.

Discussion

As we continued our series entitled "Called for More," we saw the deep importance of unity and diversity within the body of Christ. We heard the truth that God has made each of us with different gifts that make us unique. We are together called to communally reflect the glory of God in Christ, and a pivotal way we do that is because of our differences not in spite of them.

Huntington Drive Discussion Questions (Pastor Becky White)

- What have you learned from someone who has had a different life experience or cultural upbringing than you did? Think about a time when you've had such learning experiences and talk about that together as a group.
- Are there any fears, insecurities or doubts about your own abilities that keep you from pursuing what God might be inviting you into?
- Is there anything that God has nudged you to do that you are still uncertain or unwilling to engage in and do?

- What, if anything, has God called you to that may feel insignificant or completely unimportant?

Pasadena Campus Specific Questions (Pastor Michael Lee)

- As you reflect on this passage in Corinthians, what do you feel might be some specific abilities and strengths that God has personally gifted you with? Also, what in life and about the world are you passionate about? Do you see any connection between the ways in which you are gifted, and the ways in which you are passionate?
- Talk about some specific life experiences that you've had, whether pleasant or painful, that you feel have uniquely shaped you to be a blessing to the church and a blessing to your community, and even our world.
- Talk about some specific insecurities you may have, reflect and discuss with your group how God may be able to use those insecurities and weaknesses for good.

Monrovia Campus Specific Questions (Teacher Tiana Spencer)

- Has there ever been a time in your life, maybe even presently, where you may have self-sabotaged your own purpose? Talk about that together in your group.
- Name a time in your life where you felt you were overly obsessed with all the things you weren't good at, or all the areas you weren't gifted in. What was that season of your life like?
- As we saw through this scripture, the body of Christ needs what you bring, and who you are. What are some areas that you are gifted in, and how can you begin to use those gifts?

3. Apply: Next Faithful Step

As you think through 1 Corinthians 12:12-26, what might you feel is your next faithful step? Are there any gifts talents or abilities that you've been sitting on and playing it safe with? What would it look practically to take a risk and begin using your gifts, your life experiences, and all the things that make you who you are for the benefit of the church, your community, and the world? Identify one thing you can do this week to take a step in that direction.
