Michael Field

- What gets in the way of you sharing your faith with people who don't follow Jesus?
- What about your life would make people long for Jesus? What about your life gets in the way of people longing for Jesus?

3. Apply: Next Faithful Step

- Who do you know that needs to know Jesus that you need to intentionally invite deeper into your life?

Johnny Venegas

- Read Luke 9:57-62. What are the "Just let me's" that have gotten in the way of you following Jesus? What is a "just let me" that you are currently wrestling with?
- Jesus said, "the Harvest is plentiful". What does the global Harvest look like to you? What does the local Harvest look like to you?

3. Apply: Next Faithful Step

- Jesus said, "the workers are few" 2000 years ago and it appears the same is true today. Do you believe that the workers are few? If so, why? How can you be a part of building up workers?
- Jesus said "Ask the Lord of the harvest to send workers to the harvest field". What does it look like to Ask? The word "Ask" (Deomai) is the same phrase we find in Luke 5:12 and it means to *want, desire or even beg for*. Read the passage. How does that change your interpretation of Luke 10:12? And what does it look like for you to Deomai?

Tiana Spencer

- Does your life show that you are burdened for people to know Jesus? How or how not?
- What are some ways you have prioritized your comfort over others salvation? What are some steps you can take to change that?

3. Apply: Next Faithful Step

- There is nothing more valuable than what you do for the kingdom. How have you lived this out in your life? And if you haven't then how can you begin to?

Take some time to hear prayer requests from each member of your LifeGroup. Pray for one another, for your families, communities, our church, and the world.
